

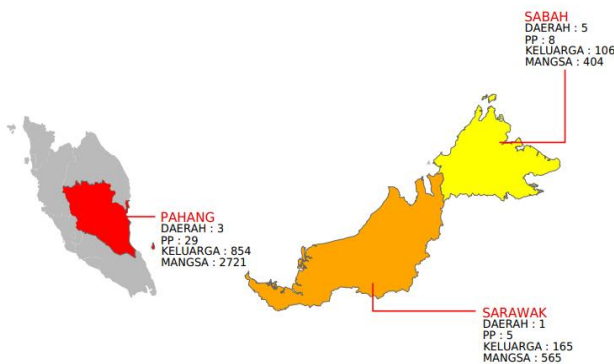
2021 MALAYSIA FLOOD SITUATION REPORT AND EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLAN



Report #7 • Period: 16-17th January 2021

Highlights

Fortunately, Sarawak, Sabah, Kelantan, Terengganu, Pahang and Johor have showed some signs of recovery from the flood disaster. For instance, most of the evacuees from Kelantan, Terengganu and Johor have returned to their homes as well as reduction in the number of evacuation centers.



With regard to the current situation, humanitarian needs are required in terms of mending damaged houses, back-to school utilities and sanitation. Also, supplying adequate food supply to ensure a quality life for the communities.

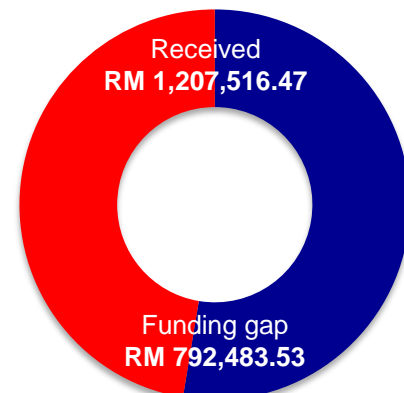

Fund appeal

1. **Pahang** - Assistance from the local community heroes were provided to distribute 270 Hygiene Kits to beneficiaries in Temerloh, Mentakab and Pusat Komuniti Chini.



2. **Pahang**– MERCY Malaysia managed to distribute 246 Hygiene Kits to three villages in Pekan:

- Kg. Temai
- Kg. Serambi
- Kg. Merchung



3. **Pahang** – The drastic flood disaster have caused the school facilities in SK Ulu Luit to be washed away or being submerged in the mud. This resulted in 134 students desperately in need of the facilities for their education purpose.

4. **Sarawak** – The Malaysian Civil Defence Force (APM) helped in distributing 600 Hygiene Kits provided by MERCY Malaysia to 5 Evacuation Centres in Kuching City.

Needs overview

Water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH)

Situation have been recovering in the Sarawak, Sabah, Kelantan, Terengganu, Pahang and Johor. However, evacuees are facing difficult situation due to the insecure condition of their houses. This insecurity could lead to contamination to the people living in such place. Assistance and support are required to encounter this issue to avoid other waterborne diseases from spreading.

Health and COVID-19

In order to protect the evacuees and communities living in the affected areas, adequate supplies of medication, face masks and hand sanitizers are needed.

Food and nutrition

Continuous supply of nutritious food is needed for the evacuees staying in the evacuation centers. This include ready-to-eat-food like biscuits, power bars, and canned food. Not to forget, evacuees who have returned home are in need of nutritious food supply such as rice and oil.

Logistics support

MERCY Malaysia require support to mobilise its teams, which includes medical team (medical officers, medical assistance and nurses), aid distribution team, technical team (for recovery assessments) and cleaning team.

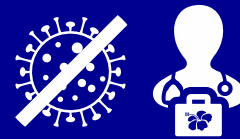
Education support
