

2021 MALAYSIA FLOOD SITUATION REPORT AND EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLAN

Report #5 • Period: 12-13th January 2021

Highlights

While situations in Peninsula Malaysia were improving, a sudden flood-hit on Sabah and Sarawak were unexpected to everyone. This was due to the continuous heavy rain that causes a dangerous rise in the water level.

Assistance such as cash aid to sustain their household, protection and sanitation, nutritious food supply are needed to ensure the evacuees are able to muddle through this flood situation.

1. The Meteorology Malaysia have forecasted continual heavy rain until 14th January 2020 in East Malaysia.

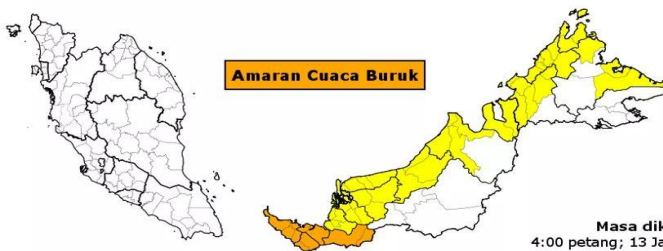
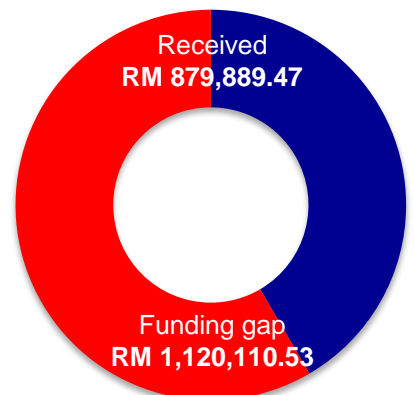

2. **Sarawak**- The Malaysian Civil Defence Force (APM) is currently monitoring and assessing the water level in the affected areas.



3. **Sarawak** - To date, 6 Evacuation Centres were opened to evacuees in Serian, Kuching, Miri.

4. **Sabah** - The flood had severely attacked areas in Pitas, Beaufort, Kota Marudu and Beluran which moved 1115 flood victims to evacuation centres.



5. **Pahang** - Fortunately, 45 Evacuation Centres are closed down in Maran on 13th January 2021 proves some good sign of recovery.

6. **Pahang** - MERCY Malaysia had delivered 729 Meals Ready to Eat (MRE) to the evacuees.

7. **Pahang** - MERCY Malaysia have distributed 3 MRE and 3 Hygiene Kits to the cleaners and security guards in Kolej Komuniti Maran that were affected by flood.



8. **Pahang** - Disinfection was conducted in Maran Basecamp on 13th January 2021 to ensure safety and sanitation.



9. **Kelantan** -Yayasan Sime Darby (YSD) distributed 500 Hygiene Kits to 14 villages in Kuala Krai:

10. **Terengganu** - Yayasan Sime Darby have delivered 500 Hygiene Kits on 12th January 2021.

Needs overview

Water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH)

Situation have been recovering in the past two days for Peninsula Malaysia . However, evacuees are facing difficult situation due to damaged house utilities. Besides, cleaning activities to be conducted to remove all the contaminated water from polluting the housing areas.

Health and COVID-19

Supplies of essential medications and consultation are required for evacuees needs. Besides, face masks and hand sanitizers are required to avoid any COVID disease from contacting.

Food and nutrition

Continuous supply of nutritious food is needed for the evacuees staying in the evacuation centers. This include ready-to-eat-food like biscuits, power bars, and canned food. Not to forget, evacuees who have returned home are in need of nutritious food supply such as rice and oil.

Logistics support

MERCY Malaysia require support to mobilise its teams, which includes medical team (medical officers, medical assistance and nurses), aid distribution team, technical team (for recovery assessments) and cleaning team.

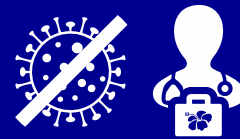
Education support
