

2021 MALAYSIA FLOOD SITUATION REPORT AND RECOVERY PLAN

Report #10 • Period: 25 – 28 January 2021

Highlights

MERCY Malaysia is moving on to recovery activities while continuing with in emergency response aid distribution based on current humanitarian needs:

Johor – distributed PPE sets to Klinik Kesehatan Bukit Indah and Hospital Kluang.



Kelantan – distributed 262 food packs from Ambassador of Qatar to 10 villages in Kuala Krai:

1. Kampung Sungai Durian
2. Kampung Chenulang
3. Kampung Batu Jong
4. Mukim Kampung Pertang
5. Kampung Mengkebang
6. Kampung Sungai Pas
7. Kampung Enggong
8. Kampung Bedal

Pahang – distributed 300 hygiene kits, 25 cartons of cleaning bleach, 30 boxes of disinfecting wipes, and 180 food packs at five locations:

1. Kampung Sungai Buloh
2. Kampung Batu Kapur
3. Taman Sagumpas
4. Taman Mentakab Indah
5. Kampung Paya Keladan

Flood recovery activity plan

Water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) and Health

1. Supplies of facemasks and hand sanitisers to help reduce the risks of COVID-19.
2. Cleaning kits, cleaning bleach, disinfecting wipes to ensure hygiene.
3. MERCY Malaysia to deliver 500 additional hygiene kits to areas in Johor.
4. Rebuilding latrines in the affected areas.



Food and nutrition

Continuous supply of nutritious food such as breakfast oat mix, ready-to-eat meal and food packs to be distributed to more far-reaching communities in the affected areas.



Damage assessment and shelter repair

1. MERCY Malaysia's Technical Team would be carrying out detail damage assessment in areas in Benta, Raub, Temerloh and Maran, Pahang.
2. To identify needs for shelter repair, kitchen kits and other recovery aid.
